LOOKING GLASS RIVER EXPEDITION SET FOR JUNE 2-5, 2016



The 2016 Looking Glass River Expedition is, in honor of the Middle Grand River Organization of Watersheds (MGROW) board member Gloria Miller of DeWitt, and the founder and president of Friends of the Looking Glass River. Clinton Conservation District is also helping to organize the Expedition.

The Expedition starts on Thursday, June 2nd and finishes on Sunday, June 5th, 2016. The four-day Expedition will begin with check-in and optional camping on the evening of Thursday, June 2nd at the DeWitt Riverside Park (405 S. Bridge Street, DeWitt, MI 48820). Friday, June 3rd, breakfast will be available for campers who stayed overnight and participant check-in will be available. Before lunch there will be presentations and a safety talk, then after lunch, shuttle to the Expedition starting point. Then, it is on the water to DeWitt. Evening activities include tours, presentations and live music. Saturday, June 4th, after breakfast and shuttle, there will be morning presentations, lunch and then a paddle to Wacousta. Evening activities include more presentations, a catered dinner, followed by live music. Sunday, June 5th, after breakfast and shuttle, the group paddles to the endpoint in Portland (lunch will be delivered en-route). *Continued on Page 2...*

INTERESTED IN VOLUNTEERING?

April showers mean May flowers—and May flowers mean it's time for rain garden volunteers. What do rain garden volunteers do? Rain gardening! Rain gardening is a lot like regular gardening, except that the crop produces a healthier Grand River, and for many people, a healthy river is as important as the vegetables and flowers that come from traditional gardens.

A lot of trash and leaves collect in the Michigan Avenue rain gardens over the winter and the volunteers will help tidy those up. A tidy rain garden is a healthy rain garden with healthy plants. Healthy plants aid in keeping the soil in the rain garden loose and able to absorb and filter rain water, which is the purpose of the rain gardens. When they filter water, clean runoff flows into the River.

MGROW currently cares for two small rain gardens along Michigan Avenue west of Pennsylvania Avenue, but would like to take on another one, or more! There is no long-term commitment. If you are interested or if you have questions, email drullingerd@mgrow.org. Or, visit www.mgrow.org.
