MAJOR CASES AND INTERESTING INCIDENTS:

- 03-04-09 Dep. Delaney took a report of an Illegal Use Of A Transaction Device. This occurred in the 2100 block of Auburn. Several unauthorized charges were made on the victim's credit card. A suspect has been identified and this complaint is still under investigation.
- 03-06-09 Dep. Delaney investigated an Embezzlement complaint at the Burger King located at 2520 E. Jolly Rd. An employee had embezzled a large sum of cash utilizing gift card transactions. The employee confessed. The next day the employee paid back the money taken and the manager no longer wished to prosecute.
- 03-10-09 Dep. Calkins investigated a Strong Armed Robbery at Rich's Country store located at 6237 Bishop Rd. The suspect went to the cash register to get change for a \$5 dollar bill and when the register was opened the suspect grabbed cash and fled out of the store. The suspect left northbound on M-99 in an older white van.
- 03-10-09 Dep. Delaney investigated a Larceny From A Building complaint at the Big Ten Party store located at 2005 N. Eifert. The suspect distracted the clerk by having retrieve a cup of water and when doing so the suspect opened the cash register and took the cash and ran out of the store.

03-11-09 Dep. Delaney investigated a Larceny From A Building complaint at the Bargain Book Store located at 2495 Cedar St. The suspect entered the store and when the clerk was not paying attention, he grabbed her purse and ran from the store. The suspect then left the store on foot.

Note: On 03-12-09 a male subject was taken into custody and charged with the above 3 crimes.

03-11-09 Dep. Richards investigated a Home Invasion which occurred in the 1500 block of Antler. The victim's residence was broken into and two rifles and one shotgun were taken. On 03-20-09, all three long guns were located at the Dicker & Deal Secondhand store. The three long guns were seized and positive identification has been made of the suspect. The suspect is still at large. Charges will be sought in this case.

03-13-09 Dep. Calkins investigated a Domestic Assault complaint which occurred in the 5100 block of Killarney. The suspect assaulted his girlfriend by choking and striking her. The suspect was located and taken into custody. The suspect was lodged on charges of Domestic Assault 2nd.

03-14-09 Dep. Shattuck investigated bad No Account Check complaint at Spanky's Dry Clean Laundry located at 2495 N. Cedar St. A female suspect on two different occasions wrote checks to the dry cleaners. Both checks were rejected by the bank because the account was closed. The suspect has been identified and charges will be sought.

03-16-09 Dep. Treat attempted to stop a vehicle for an equipment violation at Aurelius and Miller. The vehicle did not stop and continued northbound to a residence north of Jolly Rd. where it pulled into the driveway. The driver was arrested and lodged on a charge of Fleeing & Eluding III.

03-25-09 Dep. Khan investigated a Larceny From A Building complaint that occurred in the 4400 block of Tuscany. The victim reported her laptop computer missing. Subsequent investigation revealed that the laptop was stolen by a subject who is friends with the victim's granddaughter. This case is still under investigation.

03-25-09 Dep. Khan stopped a vehicle for loud exhaust at Aurelius and Willoughby. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was arrested and lodged on a charge of Operating While Intoxicated.

03-26-09 Dep. McElmurray stopped a vehicle for a moving violation at Cedar and Fay. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was arrested and lodged on a charge of Operating While Intoxicated.

03-27-09 Dep. Shattuck investigated a Domestic Assault which occurred in the 2200 block of West Blvd. The victim was thrown to the ground after having her arm twisted by her boyfriend. The boyfriend was arrested and lodged on a charge of Domestic Assault.

- 03-28-09 Dep. J. Kuch stopped a vehicle for improper lane use and an equipment violation in the 4200 block of Holt Rd. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was arrested and lodged on a charge of Operating While Intoxicated 2nd.
- 03-30-09 Dep. Khan attempted to stop a vehicle for a moving violation at Willoughby and Kingdon. The vehicle did not stop but instead sped up. The vehicle then pulled into a residence. The driver was arrested and lodged on charges of Fleeing & Eluding and Driving While License Suspended Multiple.
- 03-31-09 Dep. Treat stopped a vehicle for improper lane use and loud exhaust at M-99 and I-96. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was arrested and lodged on charges of Operating While Intoxicated 3rd (Felony) and Driving While License Suspended Multiple.
- 03-31-09 Investigated a Counterfeit Money complaint at the Burger King located at 2727 Eaton Rapids Rd. An unidentified male purchased food using a counterfeit \$20 bill. The bill was seized and sent to the U.S. Secret Service. This case is under investigation.

STATISTICS:

In March 2009, deputies took 553 written and blotter complaints. They made 113 arrests (of which 94 were self initiated). Deputies issued 263 citations. Deputies conducted 384 property/business checks, made 80 liquor inspections and spent 187 hours in Community Policing. Deputies participated in 121 hours of training.

COMMUNITY POLICE OFFICERS:

CPOs met with numerous Neighborhood watch groups. Dep. Dral attended a Gang Task Force meeting at Lansing Police Department. Dep. Dral participated in Representative Barb Byrum's Child Car Seat Safety day at Delhi Fire. Dep. Richards conducted a tour of the Delhi Division offices for Cub Scout Troop #640. Dep. A. Harrison worked with Holt High School to facilitate their Mentorship Program.

COMMUNITY BUSINESS OFFICER:

Dep. Delaney gave a presentation on counterfeit currency to the Holt Dimondale School Business Alliance breakfast meeting. Dep. Delaney attended a Gang Task Force meeting at Lansing Police Department. Dep. Delaney investigated three daytime Robberies/Larceny From a Building complaints. The suspect was identified and taken into custody.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS

I continued partnering with Holt High School to facilitate the mentorship program for students. We will have 4 students riding along with Delhi Deputies for the third trimester.

I met with Huntley Villa Management about neighborhood concerns and criminal activity in the neighborhood. I identified several problem apartments and discussed possible solutions with the management. I discussed plans for a future neighborhood watch meeting.

While Deputy Richards was off duty, I responded to Woodland Lakes Apartment complex for a report of a parking issue in the complex. They stated there is an ongoing

problem with residents and visitors parking in the fire lane. In one particular spot, it is a blind curve, and parking in the fire lane could result in a traffic collision. I wrote several citations for parking in the fire lane. As a result of the enforcement action, fire lane parking has dramatically reduced. This information was passed to Deputy Richards, who has increased patrols.

I met with a single mother who was concerned about her son posting inappropriate things on Myspace.com. I was able to assist the mother in having Myspace remove the postings. I discussed computer crime with both the mother and child.

I conducted foot patrol on Doncaster Avenue. I knocked on doors and spoke with neighbors about their concerns. I made several connections for a future neighborhood watch meeting.

I had a meeting with Melanie Allen, Holt Central High School principal about truant students. I have begun visiting the homes of several of the truant students attempting to solve the individual problems.

I have been investigating a report of a group of students possibly stealing from the 7-11 at Holt and Aurelius. An employee was able to catch and detain one of the minors stealing. 7-11 declined to prosecute, so the juvenile was turned over to her mother. I discussed the retail fraud laws with the mother and juvenile. The group has not returned to the store.

Several destruction of property reports were taken by other deputies while I was off duty in the neighborhood between Sycamore and Holt Roads, west of Aurelius. Several mailboxes were destroyed and vehicles damaged. I have increased patrols in the neighborhood and discussed the issue with neighbors. No additional crimes have been reported.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

I responded to Dakota Integrated systems for a trespass complaint. In October 2007 an employee had been fired and subsequently made threats against supervisors and other co-workers. The fired employee was served with a no trespass letter in 2007. In March 2008 he returned to the property and left additional threatening letters for staff. I made contact with the suspect and received a full confession. The suspect has agreed to not have further contact and Dakota declined to prosecute.

I responded to a home electrical fire on Chestnut Street. A smoke detector in the home went off after a minor electrical fire in the basement. I responded along with Delhi Fire Department. There were no injuries and only minor electrical damage.

I investigated a report of an assault between two Holt Junior High School Students on the school bus. Prosecution is pending.

Community Policing Highlights:

I attended the Holt Dimondale School Business Alliance breakfast meeting. I was the keynote speaker for the meeting. I conducted a counterfeit money presentation to educate community members and business owners to be able to identify counterfeit currency. I had several compliments from the attendants as well as an offer to make the presentation to a different professional group in May. I spent several hours preparing for the presentation. I was very proud of my work and I believe the group learned a lot.

I attended the Regional Gang Task Force meeting at the Lansing Police Department South Precinct. Dep. Dral and I presented several pictures of graffiti from the Delhi township area to the group and several pictures were positively identified as belonging to gangs. I also presented a handful of names to the group of suspected gang members. We also talked about a new

potentially dangerous gang that has confirmed membership in the Holt Junior High and Holt Central High schools. This information has also been forwarded to the schools.

I made a presentation to the Holt Public Schools bus drivers in response to an event that occurred on a school bus in Kalamazoo. There was an assault by a student on a bus driver that made national news. The student severely injured the bus driver. I was able to obtain a copy of the video from inside the school bus and present it to the bus drivers. Most of the drivers were shocked at the brutality of the incident. I then talked about what other options the bus driver had. The conversation between the bus drivers and I was productive and I believe I was able to provide answers to questions they had about safety.

Other Highlights:

Between 3-10-09 and 3-11-09 we responded to three daytime robberies at businesses in Delhi Township. On 3-11-09, after the third robbery, police officers including officers from Lansing Police Department and the Ingham County Sheriff's Office flooded the area trying to locate the suspect vehicle. I had seen surveillance video from one of the robberies that occurred on 3-10-09 and identified the suspect vehicle. The vehicle was very distinct. I was able to provide this information to the other officers in the area which aided in the apprehension of the suspect. Approximately an hour after the third robbery an Ingham County Sheriff's Office detective spotted the suspect vehicle. After a short vehicle and foot pursuit the suspect was apprehended. The suspect was charged with several felonies including unarmed robbery and 2 larceny from buildings in Delhi Township. I learned this same suspect is being investigated on over 10 other breaking and entering investigations that all occurred within a three day period. This suspect is being held at the jail on a 1 million dollar bond.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

I have spent numerous hours meeting with Windmill Community Park management and neighborhood watch. We have been working together to make the community there a safe place with specific concern for the young children that reside there. Most of my traffic stops have been made in Windmill Park. I have been using the radar often, in response to many of the complaints of speed through there. Since the warm weather outbreak, the children have been out playing and their safety is a great concern of everyone's.

I investigated an incident where juveniles that resided in Windmill Community Park had been involved in an altercation at the bus stop. There were approximately ten to twelve younger age juveniles involved in this incident and the parents were all contacted. Management and I elected to take preventive measures so that as warmer weather continues, these acts will not. Windmill management sent the families involved, letters of expected behavior from residents of the park.

I followed up with four anonymous drug complaints. Three of these homes were in my district and one in another. I forwarded the information to the Tri-County Metro Narcotics Team for their investigation.

I attended at Gang Task Force meeting at the Lansing Police, South Precinct.

I attended Representative Barb Byrum's Child car seat safety day at Delhi Fire. Representative Byrum set up an evening where she and experts taught how to properly secure a child car seat in a vehicle. I represented the Ingham County Sheriff's Office, speaking with the children, their parents and handed out ICSO bicycle safety and seatbelt safety cards.

I attended a neighborhood watch meeting at Windmill Community Park. Two new members attended this meeting as well. We spoke of the recent juvenile problem, and volunteers were organized to be at the bus stop at the end of school hours (mid-day) to prevent future problems.

I attended the community dinner at Windmill Community Park.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

I assisted on a Robbery that occurred at the Big Ten Party Store. I assisted with perimeter and checking the area for the suspect.

I also assisted on another Robbery that occurred the following day. Two suspects were caught within hours. I transported one of the suspects to the Delhi Office where he was interviewed by the investigating officer.

I assisted Delhi Fire on a grass fire that spread out of control near M-99 and I-96 area

I assisted Sergeant Bob Ott with a fuel spill at the Speedway Station on Jolly Rd. Nearly 60 gallons of fuel had been dumped when the driver of a UHAUL had hit the fuel pump upon leaving with his vehicle. The business closed down for daily business until hazardous material cleaned up the fuel spill.

I responded to a medical on Grovenburg Rd. for a male not breathing. The subject was found to be deceased. The subject was transported to Sparrow for an autopsy and family was notified. I turned the complaint over to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

I made an arrest on a male subject for violating a personal protection order. The subject was lodged at Ingham County Jail.

I am seeking a warrant on a female subject for possession of marijuana. I observed the subject in a vehicle and rolling a marijuana cigarette. During a consent search of the vehicle, marijuana was found in the rear seat. The report was turned over to the Ingham County Prosecutor's Office for a warrant request on the female subject.

I responded to Windmill Park for a suicidal person. I transported the subject to Community Mental Health for evaluation.

I conducted two forensic interviews on two sexual assault cases to assist other deputies.

I made 12 Business Checks and also conducted a liquor inspection this month.

TRAINING:

I attended sexual assault training for two days in Bay City.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

I met with the coordinators from the following Neighborhood Watch groups this month.

Cedar Heights Subdivision.

Hunters Glenn Subdivision.

PineDell Subdivision.

Ivywood Estates Subdivision.

Dutch Meadows Subdivision.

College Heights Subdivision.

Lamoreaux Subdivision .

I spoke with all coordinators about the current issues in their neighborhoods. I asked all if there were any upcoming meetings that I should be aware of.

I received information from several of the groups about possible late spring, early summer subdivision meetings. They will forward me the details as they receive them.

I conducted a tour of the Delhi office to the Cub Scout Troop #640 (Horizon Elem.). I led over fifteen children and adults through our office that is comprised of several sections that aid our police operations. I explained the various tools that we have not only on our persons, but also in our patrol vehicles. I explained the different duties that many officers have within the building/division. I briefly explained report writing and its importance in our profession. All enjoyed the tour. The police vehicle's siren and lights were a hit. I also spoke to them about the other police vehicle that I use; the Mountain bike. I emphasized the importance of wearing an approved helmet while riding a bicycle.

I patrolled many streets within neighborhoods/subdivisions in my district during the month of March. I patrolled not only in the patrol vehicle, but on the Mountain Bike. I made many stops (49) on vehicles for various infractions. I issued several citations for observed infractions. One traffic stop on the mountain bike resulted in a suspended driver. An arrest was made and I had an available Delhi unit transport the person for me to the Ingham County Jail.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

I responded to a breaking and entering/MDOP of school property complaint at the Hope Middle School. I spoke with the reporting party who then showed me to their roof top boiler room. Apparently the roof had been accessed and the room entered over a weekend in March. Grease from a grease gun had been spread over several walls and a fire extinguisher had been set off. Approx. \$100.00 in damage. I took photos and dusted for prints. I spoke with an employee that gave me a name of a boy that may have additional information. I located this individual and interviewed him. This interview then led me to several other suspects and subsequent interviews. I received three confessions to the damage in the room. At this time Holt Schools is not seeking prosecution. They wish to deal with this internally.

I took a late report of a home invasion. I was advised that while they were gone for the day, someone had entered their home via the side service door of their garage. Taken were three long guns and an Ipod. I dusted for prints, fumed several items, and took photos. The victims suspect their brother who was currently staying with them. As a result of my investigation, I located the stolen guns at Dicker and Deal in Lansing. I recovered the guns from Dicker and Deal and placed them into Evidence. I received additional evidential information from Dicker and Deal identifying the brother as the suspect in this case. I am currently seeking a warrant for his arrest.
