MAJOR CASES & INTERESTING INCIDENTS:

- 05-08-09 Dep. Treat stopped a vehicle for multiple equipment violations at Kate and Harding. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. A 10 year child was a passenger in the vehicle. The driver was arrested and lodged on charges of Operating While Intoxicated 3rd (Felony) and Child Endangerment.
- 05-11-09 Dep. J. Kuch took a report of Malicious Destruction of Property at the Sycamore Elementary School located at 4429 Sycamore. A skylight had been broken out. Interior of building checked secure. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Dep. Treat took a report of Arson and Malicious Destruction of Property in the 1800 block of Schoolcraft. A Granger trash container had been set on fire and a vehicle parked on the street had been spray painted with two windows smashed out. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Dep. Shattuck took a report of Arson in the 2200 block of Anchor Ct. A wood swing set had been set on fire. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Dep. Calkins took a report of Malicious Destruction of Property in the 1700 block of Schoolcraft. A vehicle parked on the roadway had been spray painted. No suspects at the time of the report.

- 05-13-09 Dep. Calkins took a report of Malicious Destruction of Property in the 1700 block of Schoolcraft. The garage door of the residence had been spray painted and the mail box had been smashed. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Dep. Hutting took a report of Malicious Destruction of Property at the church located at 4331 Hall. The area over the entrance had been spray painted along with the carpet at the entrance. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Dep. Calkins took a report of Arson in the 1700 block of Schoolcraft. Suspect(s) had attempted to set a motor home on fire. No suspects at the time of the report.
- 05-13-09 Sgt. Southwick took a report of Malicious Destruction of Property at the Sycamore Elementary School located at 4429 Sycamore. A skylight had been broken out for the second time. Four Exterior windows had been broken out. No suspects at the time of the report.
- NOTE:** During the late morning hours of 05-13-09 a resident/victim of the property destruction contacted police for a suspicious vehicle in the area. Officers were quick to respond and able to stop the vehicle and identify the subjects. After a lengthy investigation and many hours of interviews, the occupants of the vehicle were identified as the suspects in the above noted Arson and Malicious Destruction of Property reports. Four suspects were arrested and lodged for the above crimes. A fifth suspect has been identified and is also being charged in the above crimes. Also, during the interviews it was discovered that the same 5 individuals were responsible for a number of Malicious Destruction of Property crimes that had occurred at or near the end of April 2009 in Delhi Township. The five suspects will also face charges on those crimes.
- 05-14-09 Dep. Khan stopped a vehicle for equipment violations at Aurelius and Cricket Ridge. The subsequent investigation revealed the driver to be intoxicated. The driver was arrested and lodged on charges of Operating While Intoxicated 3rd (Felony).
- 05-22-09 Dep. Treat investigated a Home Invasion which occurred in the 1900 block of Schoolcraft. A number of antique items along with home improvement supplies had been taken. This incident is under investigation.
- 05-25-09 Dep. Shattuck responded to a residence in the 2400 block of N. Eifert on a complaint of an unwanted subject. The caller's ex-boyfriend was at the residence and had just been released from jail for assaulting the caller. The ex-boyfriend was found to be in violation of one of the conditions of his bond which was to have no contact with the caller. The ex-boyfriend was arrested and lodged for Violation of a Conditional Bond.
- 05-25-09 Dep. Khan investigated a Felonious Assault that occurred in the 4200 block of Woodworth. The victim alleged the suspect pointed a crossbow at him and threatened to kill him. A search of the suspect's residence and vehicles did not reveal a crossbow or any evidence of a crossbow. This report has been forwarded to the Ingham County Prosecutor's Office for their review.

05-27-09 Dep. Hutting investigated a Home Invasion which occurred in the 5500 block of Saddlewood. Taken from the caller's garage was a 5 gallon gas can and yard lights. Suspects have been identified and charges are being sought.

05-28-09 Dep. Richards investigated a Home Invasion that occurred in the 5700 block of McCue. Suspect(s) entered the caller's garage and took a rifle which had been secured in the trunk of the caller's vehicle. The suspect has been identified. This case is under investigation.

05-29-09 Dep. Grant investigated a Home Invasion which occurred in the 4300 block of Dell Rd. Suspect(s) entered the caller's residence and took a flat screen television, a laptop computer, two digital cameras, cash and jewelry. This case is under investigation.

NOTE: In early May 2009, officers, while researching Home Invasion cases discovered a subject had been pawning property that matched descriptions from a number of Home Invasions and Larceny From Building complaints. Officers located the subject at the Ingham County Jail where they conducted an interview. During the course of the interview the subject admitted to numerous Home Invasions/Larceny From Building complaints. The subject has subsequently been charged and arraigned on those charges.

STATISTICS:

In May 2009, deputies took 606 written/blotter complaints. They made 115 arrests (of which 94 were self initiated). Deputies issued 190 citations. Deputies conducted 277 business/property checks, made 55 liquor inspections and spent 152 hours in Community Policing. Deputies participated in 172 hours of training.

COMMUNITY POLICE OFFICERS:

All CPOs attended the Safety Patrol Picnic at Hawk Island Park. Dep. A. Harrison participated in "Portfolio Days" at the Holt 9th Grade Campus as well as "Mentorship Days" at the Holt High School. Dep. Richards met with the management of Woodland Lakes Estates to help form a Neighborhood watch group. Dep. Dral participated in the Arson/Malicious Destruction of Property investigations.

COMMUNITY BUSINESS OFFICER:

Dep. Delaney gave a presentation on counterfeit currency to the Holt Lions Club at their May meeting. Dep. Delaney attended a two week driving instructor course to assist in training deputies in precision driving.

COMMUNITY POLICINIG HIGHLIGHTS

I attended the Holt High School 9th grade campus "Portfolio Days." The students prepare a portfolio including there career, educational interests and life plans and present the information in an interview style setting.

I attended the after school study program at Delhi Manor. The program is put on by the school district for elementary student who reside in Delhi Manor. The tutoring is held every Tuesday after school.

I received a report of a suspicious person in the Sugar Bush neighborhood. I increased patrols and the subject has not been seen again.

I met with Holt Junior High School administration to discuss a frequently truant student. The student had been cited previously for truancy. I went to the student's home and made contact with her and her mother and discussed a plan to increase attendance and resolve home issues.

I attended the Midway Elementary school carnival. The carnival is held annually for the students. I showed students the patrol vehicle and discussed safety.

I addressed community residents at two Neighborhood Watch meetings during the month of May. I attended the Schoolcraft Neighborhood Watch meeting and updated the neighbors on the arrests made in the recent, multiple destruction of property and arson cases that occurred in their neighborhood. I attended the Sugar Bush Neighborhood Watch meeting. The neighbors had a pot luck and I provided a police brief and safety tips.

I attended the annual School Safety Picnic at Hawk Island Park. I spoke with students about safety and assisted in operating the seatbelt convincer.

I attended the Holt High School Mentorship Days. 10th, 11th and 12th grade students prepare a portfolio outlining their educational, career and life goals. I spoke with two students in a group setting that were interested in Law Enforcement.

I made it a priority to patrol every area of my district this month. I did vehicle or foot patrol in all neighborhoods, business districts and main roadways. In addition, I began to increase patrols at the Skate Park and Junior High School softball diamond, due to increased springtime activity.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

I responded to a Hit and Run Personal Injury Accident at Cedar Street and Delhi Commerce Drive. I collected a piece of the suspect vehicle bumper that was left at the scene. I took the bumper to Schram's Auto Parts and the employees identified the bumper as belonging to a 2001-2006 Chrysler Sebring. I then completed a press release with the suspect vehicle information. Several weeks later I received a tip providing me with a license plate. With the assistance of Lansing Police Officer Martha McGonegal and Deputy Tryon Calkins, the vehicle and driver were located. I then conducted an interview with the suspect and received a full confession. Charges are being sought for leaving the scene of personal injury accident and driving while license suspended.

I responded to a 4 car personal injury accident at Holt Road and Grovenburg Road. The at-fault driver was distracted, crossed the center line and collided with a CATA bus. The at-fault driver then struck another oncoming vehicle, causing that vehicle to strike another vehicle. Two drivers were pinned in and removed by Windsor and Delhi Township ambulances. All drivers have been treated and subsequently released with minor injuries, despite massive vehicle damage.

I received a complaint of suspected Child Abuse. I conducted a complete investigation, including a forensic interview of the Child. The complaint was determined to not be a crime, but also forwarded to Child Protective Services.

I had taken the first twelve days of May off as vacation time, and I also attended the Sheriff's Office annual training this month.

COMMUNITY POLICING:

I attended the Safety Patrol Picnic at Hawk Island Park. There were several Police and Fire agencies, as well as several students from the Lansing school district. Here the Police and Fire personnel can show the students the utilities they have to help them when citizens are in need. It is also a fun day with food and music for the students.

I am investigating an assault that occurred on the school bus at Windmill Trailer Park. The victim and suspect both reside in Windmill Trailer Park and both are juveniles claiming each other were the victims. This is an ongoing investigation due to the amount of witnesses that need to be interviewed.

I investigated a domestic assault that occurred in Windmill Trailer park. The report was sent to the Ingham County Prosecutor's Office for review and possible warrant authorization. No visible injury, no witnesses.

I took a report of a threats complaint that occurred over the telephone. The reporting party resided in Windmill and did not want any further consequences for the suspect/ her sister. I made contact with the caller and phone calls have stopped.

ADDITIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

I responded to a truancy complaint where a juvenile refused to attend school. I have dealt with this family before and the mother did not know where else to turn. I cited the juvenile for truancy and transported her back to school. I spoke with the mother a week later, and she stated her daughter had been attending school more after my "lecture" with her. She thanked me.

I took an internet pornography complaint where an unknown male had been sending the complainants juvenile daughter inappropriate emails and photos. I saved the appropriate messages needed through Yahoo and MySpace via fax requests and turned the report over to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

I investigated several Malicious Destruction of Property incidents on Schoolcraft before several of the juvenile suspects were caught the following day.

I have been following up on some sexual assaults that I have been investigating and assisting on with forensic interviews.

COMMUNITY POLICING HIGHLIGHTS:

I patrolled many of my district's subdivisions throughout the month. I patrolled both in a car and on a mountain bike. I initiated forty (40) stops most of which were done in my district. Traffic stops were for various offenses. I issued ten (10) citations for traffic offenses. I was approached by many neighbors in my district that stated that they enjoyed seeing the police on bicycles in their neighborhoods.

I met with the coordinators from the following neighborhood watch groups: the Pinedell subdivision; the Cedar Heights subdivision; the Dutch Meadows subdivision; the Hunter's Glen subdivision; the College Heights subdivision; the Lamoreaux subdivision; and the Ivywood Estates subdivision. All coordinators were met informally.

We discussed upcoming agendas and neighborhood issues (ie. upcoming neighborhood gatherings, foreclosed homes, current construction on streets/sidewalks, and other matters). I advised all of my coordinators of the upcoming National Night Out that was scheduled for August.

I met formally with Mr. Jim Combs and the management team of Woodland Lakes Estates. We discussed the planning and creation of a neighborhood/apartment building community watch for their property. We discussed many points of a watch formation for the apartment complex. The meeting and information that was discussed was well received. Future meetings were also discussed to help launch this watch group (possibly as soon as June). The creation of this apartment complex watch would be my largest watch group to date.

I attended an all area safety picnic at Hawk Island. Many local police agencies were present for this event. Several hundred school children attended the safety picnic. I not only patrolled the area, but I also operated the seat belt convincer. We had over a hundred children participate in the seat belt convincer demonstration.

I participated in a narcotics raid on a home in my district. Taken out of the home were several pounds of marijuana and a gun. The raid was completed without incident. The home was made known to our narcotics unit by a tip that I had received from one of my coordinators within that subdivision. I called METRO narcotics to advise them of the information. The suspect was arrested and the contraband was seized.

I met with Pastor Franzel to discuss the upcoming bicycle safety rodeo. A flier was generated and distributed to all Holt schools excluding the High School. I also contacted the Delhi Twp Clerk's office to have this information of the rodeo added to their events list and electronic bulletin board. I allocated extra bicycle helmets for those that do not have one. I am anticipating a good turnout for the June 20th event.

OTHER MATTERS:

I investigated an attempted robbery of a person by knife point. The victim was not injured nor did they have anything taken from them. The suspect left on foot through the apartment complex. Use of a canine and foot search of the area was unsuccessful. A sketch artist was brought in to draw the suspect from the victim's statements. The sketch has been distributed to all media with hope of gaining suspect information.

I investigated many harassment cases this month. Most of the harassment complaints calls were suspects calling the victims multiple times over the phone. I spoke to all suspects and advised them to discontinue the phone calls or they could possibly have charges brought them.

I also investigated several motor vehicle accidents. Most of which were property damage accidents involving two or more cars. Citations issued accordingly to the at-fault drivers.
