RE: Delhi Division Monthly Report for the month of August, 2018

Noteworthy Events:

National Night Out took place on August 7 at Veterans Memorial Gardens. National Night Out takes place annually around the nation to promote police-community relationships. Delhi Fire partnered with the Delhi ICSO staff to plan and host this very successful event for the community.

August 9, Lt. Jungel, SRO Dep. Matt Hutting, Delhi Fire Chief Ball and Jim Porcello presented the results of the 2017 Holt Schools security assessments to a joint meeting of the HPSK school board and administration.

August 18, the staff assisted with Holt Hometown and assisted in making it a very safe and crime free event for the community.

New Delhi Staff:

In August, Delhi said goodbye to School Resource Officer Dep. Matt Hutting, Business Dep. James Rowley and Dep. Adam Jackson, who all went on to other assignments at ICSO. All three performed their jobs exceptionally well and served the community with the highest level of professionalism and dedication.

We welcomed the new Delhi business Officer, Deputy Andy Duling, new School Resource Officer, Deputy Bill Belanger, and Deputy Jonte Slack to general

patrol. These three professionals have proven themselves to be outstanding police officers while in previous assignments and will carry on the community policing mission in an exemplary manner for Delhi Township.

Highlighted Calls for Service:

August 1:

Deputies responded to N. Aurelius Road for a missing juvenile. The 9 year old female was located by Deputies at a friend's residence within an hour.

August 2:

Deputies responded to a domestic on Dean Avenue and subsequently arrested a suspect for domestic assault.

August 4:

Deputies responded multiple times to Houghton Hollow for an ongoing domestic dispute.

August 7:

Deputies investigated multiple larcenies from vehicles. All vehicles had been left unlocked. Subsequent investigation led to the identification of 5 suspects and prosecution is pending.

August 11:

Deputies responded to a malicious destruction of property complaint at Huntley Villa. This was the 4th time the victim had reported her tires being slashed. The Deputies subsequently located and arrested the victim's estranged husband for the crimes.

August 14:

Deputies responded to an on-going trespassing complaint in a field behind Burger King and Champions Sports Bar. The male suspect was found and arrested on warrants. The female suspect had outstanding warrants. She was not initially located and was tracked into a heavily wooded and fenced area containing a drainage pond. A K9 track led to a drainage pipe entry and it was thought the female had fled into the pipes. Delhi Fire and Delhi Public Services responded to the scene to assist in rescuing the female from the pipes. A robotic camera system was deployed by public services and confirmed that the woman was not in the pipes at that location.

August 15:

Deputies responded to a neighbor dispute on Keller Road in which a gun was seen. The parties were separated and no one was injured.

August 17:

Delhi Deputies were assisted the Violent Crimes Initiative and Detectives attempting to arrest a suspect at Huntley Villa Apartments. The suspect was followed into Lansing and then attempted to flee when a traffic stop was attempted. The suspect was taken into custody without injury to officers or suspect. 3 handguns and a large amount of cocaine were seized and prosecution in pending.

August 18:

Deputies responded to an intoxicated subject at Burchfield Park and subsequently arrested the male suspect for OWI as he was leaving the park.

Deputies responded to Happys Inn Motel to check on a small child crying. A male subject was found inside a room unconscious suffering an apparent overdose. Narcan was administered to the subject by Deputies and he regained consciousness and was transported to the ER by Delhi Fire.

August 22:

Deputies investigated a larceny from an automobile on Glenbury and are pursuing charges against several suspects.

August 27:

Deputies responded to a suicidal subject and transported for treatment.

August 30:

Deputies responded to a missing person report at a nursing home and determined the man had planned his exit from the home in advance by arranging a friend to pick him up due to his meds being reduced.

Deputies investigated a home invasion at a residence on Grovenburg.

August 31:

Delhi Deputies executed a search warrant in the City of Lansing as a result of an on-going investigation into larcenies from automobiles.

STATISTICS:

During the month of August, Delhi Deputies responded to 302 calls for service, made 261 traffic stops and wrote 83 citations. They investigated 32 traffic crashes. They also made 37 arrests, 26 of which were self-initiated, proactive arrests. Deputies dedicated 256 hours to community policing and participated in 179 hours of annual training.

On August 27th I met with the Homecoming planning committee where we discussed the parade route and traffic control for the event.

COMPLAINTS:

During the month of August I responded to a total of 4 calls for service as the School Resource Officer. These calls included requests for back-up by other deputies as well as complaints that did not require a written report. The calls for service included: A Civil dispute, A medical assist, a trespassing issue and a missing student.

On August 24th I was contacted by Dr. Hornak regarding a trespassing issue. I made contact with the violator and reminded them that they were not allowed to be on school property.

On August 27th I responded to the Holt High School practice football field for a student that had a medical issue while at practice. The student was stabilized and transported to the hospital without incident.

On August 28th I responded to Delhi Manor in regards to a Civil Dispute.

On August 29th I assisted Holt High School Staff with locating a missing student. The student was found to have left with a parent without checking out.

TRAINING:

On August 15th I attended a conference for School Resource Officers that was put on by the Prosecutors Attorney Association of Michigan. I networked with other School Resource Officers from around the state and received an introduction to being a Resource Officer as well as tips for forensic interviewing and a legal update

I attended TEAM training at Michigan State Police Headquarters from August 20th through August 23rd. I learned the TEAM curriculum which I can teach in school classrooms.

Note that my first working shift at the Delhi Township Business Officer was Monday August 20th. These statistics include all of my working shifts in August of 2018.

On August 21st I attended Lansing Christian School's school year kick-off assembly. I also assisted Tri County Metro Narcotics with a traffic stop resulting in the seizure of a large amount of cocaine that was being sent via mail to an abandon building in Delhi Township. The suspect was arrested and the investigation is ongoing with Tri County Narcotics.

On August 23rd I participated in a special assignment focused on distracted driving. Participants included Sheriff Scott Wriggelsworth and his entire administration along with multiple Ingham County Detectives and Deputies. A total of 39 traffic stops were made resulting in 27 citations and 1 physical arrest.

On August 31st I assisted Deputy Torok with executing a search warrant on a suspect residence. Delhi Deputies responded to multiple reports of larceny from automobiles this morning and the suspect was generated. The investigation is ongoing.

I have only included the highlights of them month after starting my new assignment.
